Goal statement

Discussion

Important considerations in developing the goal statement:

- Seniors are a diverse group should not be lumped together as in poor health or confined to their homes. They hold jobs and are caretakers, neighbors, and volunteers.
- Many channels should be used to reach senior residents (all residents really) because preferences vary.
- Make it as easy as possible for residents to be able to receive and find the information they need directly and not have to depend on intermediaries.
- Don't just speak to seniors, speak to all
- Think broadly. AARP began as an organization for retired people but they target everyone 50+.
- Our process should focus on all residents of a community age-friendly and accommodating everyone.
- Community friendly will unite residents and visitors
- Need to consider how channels can be made widely visible and known.
- Not only explain what is on offer but also how to take advantage of it.
