 - Question slips will be offered to attendees for the moderated Q&A portion of the presentation, in addition to feedback slips to gather information from attendees
- Continued discussion on planning for the City-Wide Block Party that is scheduled for September 13, 2022
 - Ted Page will create a task list for side bar discussions and follow up at the CPC's next meeting

New Business

- Requests for nominations for the open position of CPC's vice chair was open to members
 - A single nomination was made by Robin Winter for Ed Mephram to fill the position
 - The motion was made to vote and supported by Ted Page, followed by a unanimous vote for acceptance of the motion

- Additional fundraising discussions were tabled based on the limited events going on
