Royal Oak Police to step up Enforcement Efforts on Woodward Avenue

As part of an on-going effort to reduce unsafe driving and maintain the quality of life for residents and businesses along Woodward Avenue, the Royal Oak Police will be stepping up patrols on Woodward. Every year, the police department receives a multitude of complaints regarding loud vehicles, revving engines, squealing tires and vehicles accelerating quickly from traffic lights. In addition, we receive complaints of cruisers congregating in parking lots, creating disturbances and leaving trash.

As part of the initiative, the Royal Oak Police Department will begin taking strict enforcement actions on vehicles being driven in a manner that is unsafe or violating traffic laws. Additionally,

the parking lots along Woodward are private property and, at the request of our business owners, the police department will be patrolling business parking lots, issuing parking tickets, and moving people out of the parking lots that are there illegally.

Summertime “cruising” on Woodward has been an ongoing issue over the past several years. We will continue to evaluate these efforts and explore solutions to ensure Royal Oak is always a great place to live, work, and play.
