The year 1975-76 will probably be remembered as a year of recovery and optimism for the United States. A sense of rebirth seemed to be felt by the American people, as plans were made to celebrate our nation's 200th birthday. The economy began to thrive again, buoyed by the confidence of the American people. President Gerald Ford welcomed Emperor Hirohito and his wife of Japan on their visit to the U. S. New York City was saved from financial default by last-minute aid from the government, and only the outbreak of fighting in Angola caused a new worry on the world scene.

In the world of sports, continuity was the key, as Jack Nicklaus won two of four major golf championships, Muhammed Ali retained his heavyweight boxing title, and the Pittsburgh Steelers won the Superbowl again. But the year saw a new Winter Olympics in Austria and this summer in Montreal. Dominant personalities were U. S. Ambassador to the U.N. Patrick Moynihan, Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn who won the Nobel Prize for Literature, and the ever-present Kennedys. Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas resigned, and Patty Hearst was apprehended and tried.

In the arts, musicians like Bob Dylan and Joan Baez and groups like Chicago were still giving concerts. One of the year's top movies was "The Sunshine Boys".


Above all, 1975-76 should be remembered as a year America seemed to come alive with an enthusiastic celebration of the Bicentennial and renewed promise for the future.
































Art Brings Out Your Feelings

Art classes were very busy this year. They made several projects which included 3-D animals, paintings and drawings.


The Art Classes put their works in the mainhall showcases several times this year. Their works were also shown after the band concerts in the art rooms.




When Mel's family (Harry, Jessie, Pearl and Pauline) comes to help out, everything ends up in total chaos.

A good time are the only words which truly describe what goes on in the Drama Club. The cast parties, the set-crew meetings and the dress rehearsals were truly nothing but good times.



One Class Does Something Constructive





The main activity of the group is the blood bank held every spring, where members are allowed to assist the nurses. This year they also participated in a Mock Disaster.


The club has set further goals for the remainder of the year. They intend to have more speakers, tours and are planning another trip to Toronto and also to Chicago where they will visit the Science Museum.

SEOVEC Trains For Jobs




