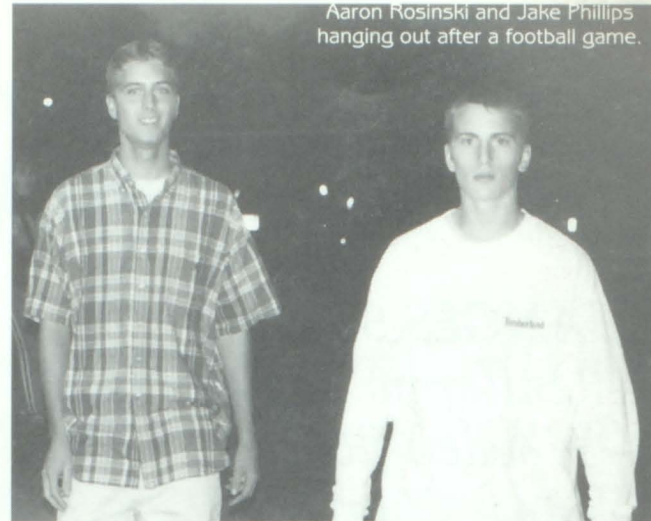

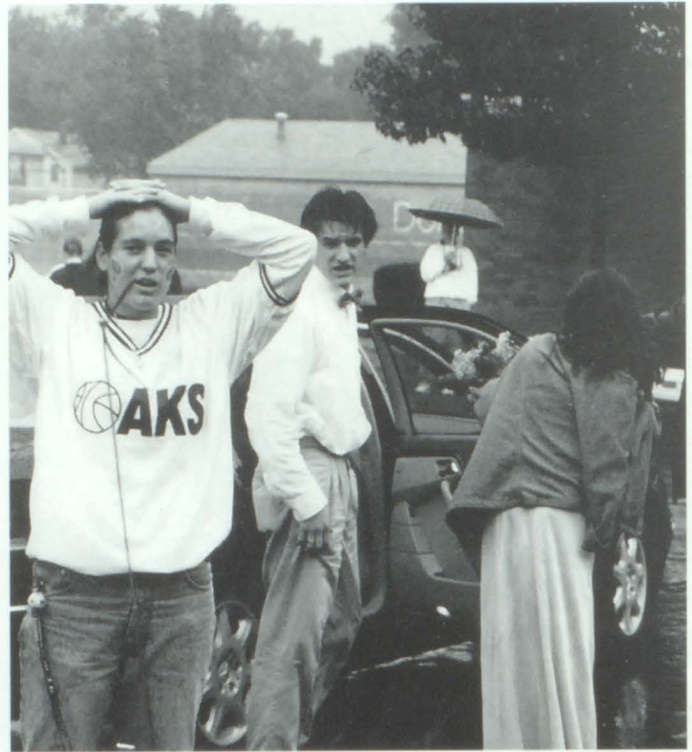

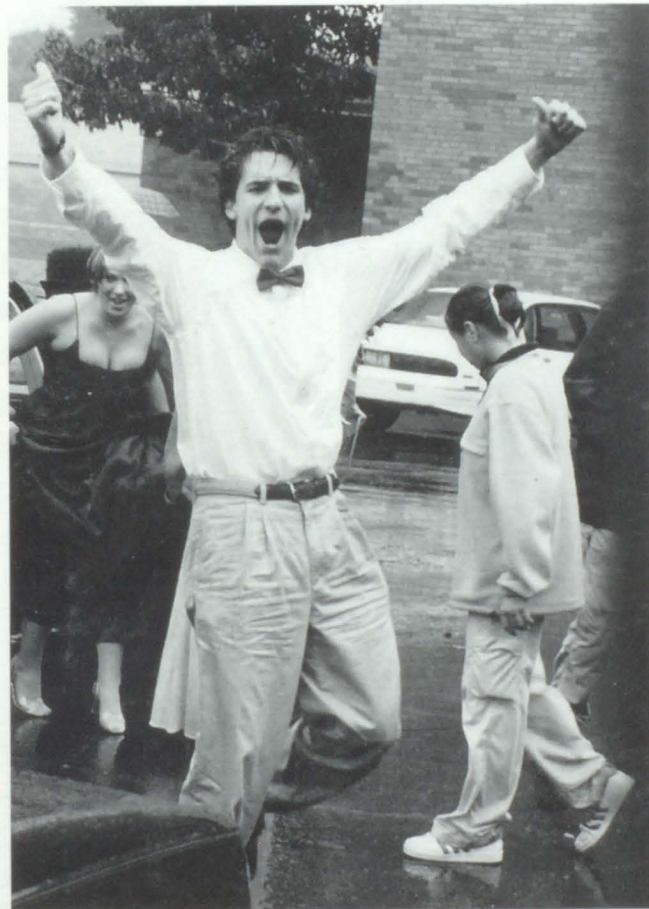

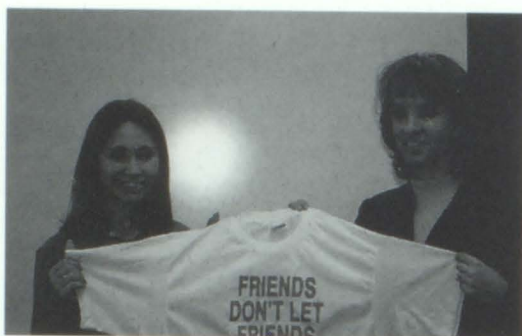

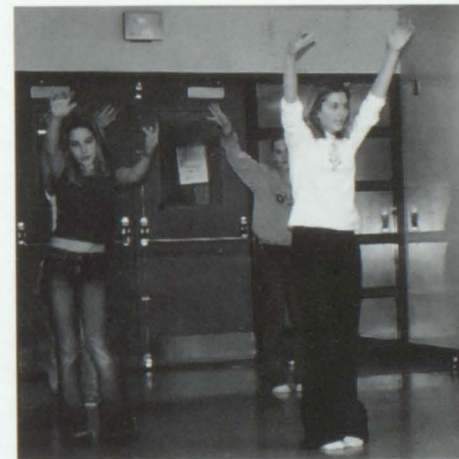

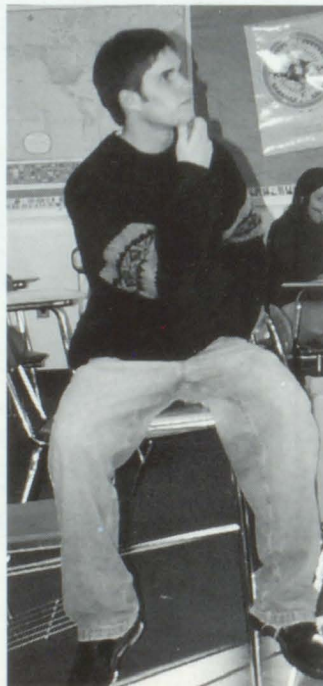

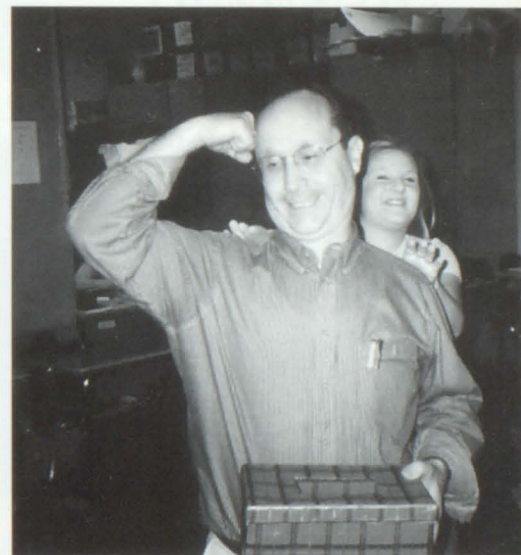

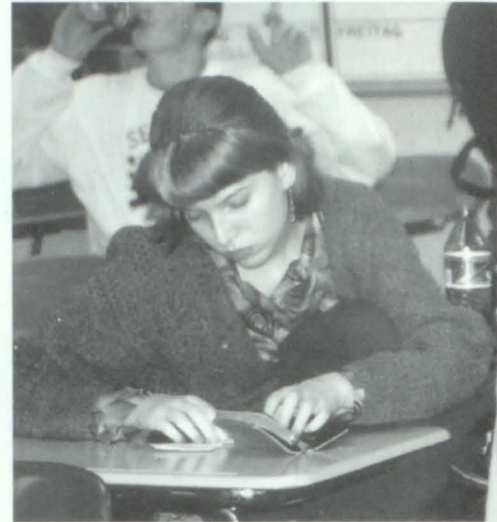
Foreign Languages

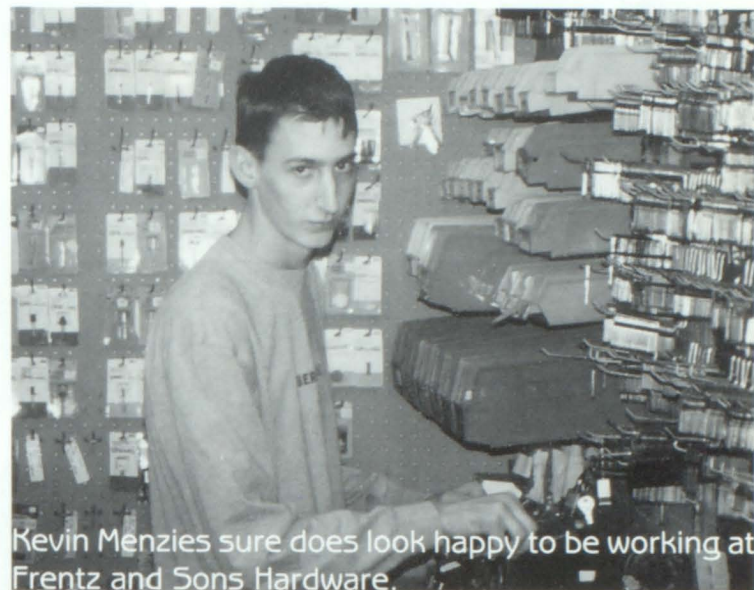

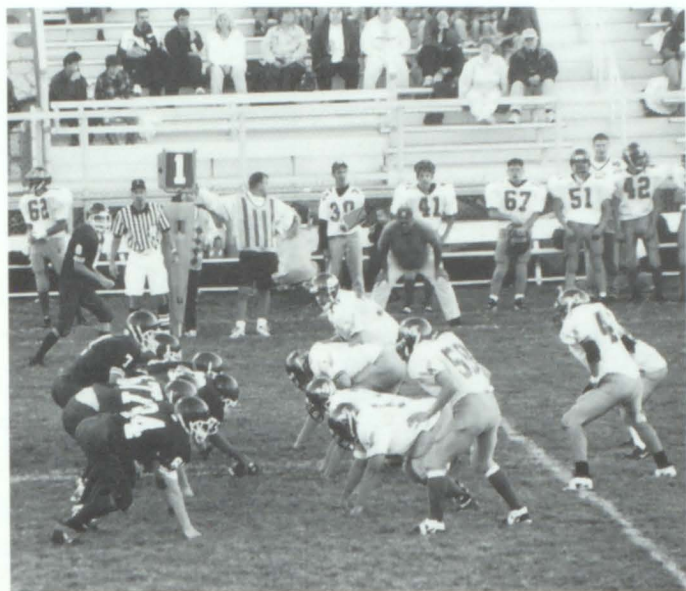

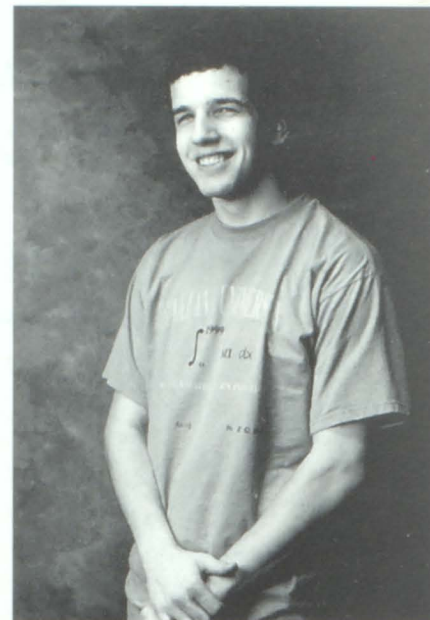
Technology

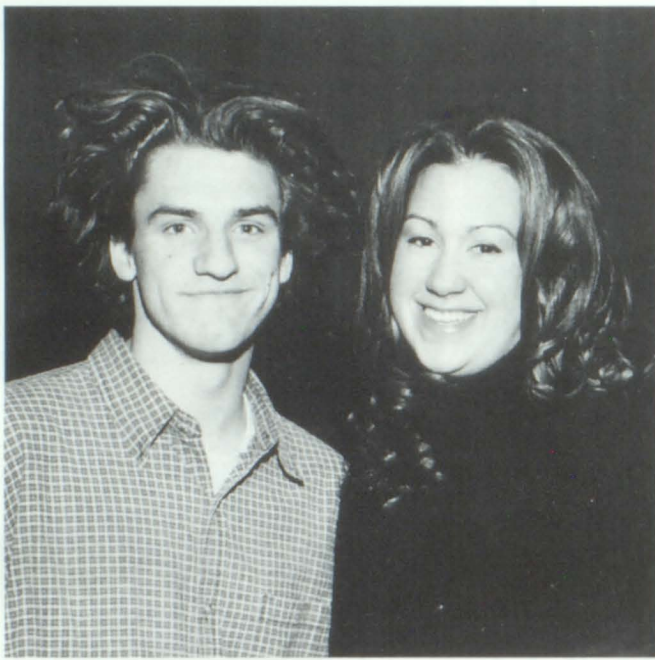
Drama
